

Cited as a 'new national treasure', Karine is a multiaward-winning Scottish songwriter and musician. In 2016, in association with Edinburgh International Festival



King Creosote

AKA Kenny Anderson, from Fife, he is one of Scotland's most prolific contemporary artists having released over 40 albums. He has been nominated for the UK Mercury Prize and the Scottish Album of the Year. In

2014, as part of the Glasgow Commonwealth Games celebrations, he wrote the entire soundtrack for the acclaimed archival film by Virginia Heath From Scotland With Love.
