Background

- Breastfeeding and health
 - WHO recommends exclusive breastfeeding until 6 months
 - For the baby: infection, diarrhoea, vomiting, obesity
 - For the mother: breast and ovarian cancer, osteoporosis CVD and obesity
- Breastfeeding in the UK and Yorkshire
 - UK, 2010, breastfeeding prevalence at birth, 6 weeks and 6 months was 83%, 57%
 and 36%
 - UK, 2010, exclusive breastfeeding at 6 months only 1%
 - UK, 2018, prevalence at 6-8 weeks: 46% (variation within local authorities: 23%-79%;
 Public Health England, 2019)
 - Yorkshire and the Humber generally lower than the rest of England / UK
 - 2010, 11% of UK mothers reported being stopped or made to feel uncomfortable when breastfeeding in public
 - 2010 Equality Act, unlawful for a business to discriminate against a breastfeeding woman




Data analysis

- Acceptability
 - 'Always acceptable': breastfeeding in public is always acceptable.
 - 'Acceptable with discretion'
 - 'Not acceptable'
- Cohen's kappa inter-rater reliability
 - 60 comments 3 sets of 20 comments in pairs
- Thematic analysis
 - Set of reoccurring themes and related sub themes
 - Hierarchical structure and relationships
 - Themes and connectivity compared for consistency and accuracy across the research team




Our data



- Average Cohen's kappa (inter-rater reliability) 0.87
- Differences in opinion by media outlet
- Overall, 19.9% of comments expressed the idea that breastfeeding in public was never acceptable

Reflection and expansion

- Sexual breast not that prominent
- Women in society
- Disgust
- How widely held are those views?
 - Relative importance of each?
 - Can anything be done about any of those?
- Who?
- Where?



Survey

- Open from May 2016 to May 2017
- 60 attitude items scored on a 7 point scale ranging from strongly disagree to strongly agree
- Demographic questions (age, gender, nationality, children, education attainment, religion affiliation and household income, media usage)
- BBC Radio Sheffield and Hallam FM (June 2016)
- 7190 respondents



Data analysis

- Factor analysis to identify relevant dimensions in the data
- Ordinary least squares (OLS) regression analysis used to identify the dimensions predicted respondent attitudes
 - It is always acceptable to breastfeed in public'
 - It is never acceptable to breastfeed in public'
- Influence of respondent demographics and behaviour on the attitudes towards breastfeeding in public dimensions assessed using Welch's t-tests and Games-Howell multiple comparison procedures for the one-way ANOVAs



Factor Analysis

68.29% of the variance explained.

Parallel analysis using a Monte Carlo Simulation confirmed the 12-dimension structure.



Dimensions influencing acceptance and opposition to breastfeeding in public

Factors influencing acceptance

- Women in society
 - Social exclusion of breastfeeding mothers
 - Mothers who breastfeed in public are self-absorbed and inconsiderate
 - Mothers who breastfeed in public feel uncomfortable and vulnerable
- Breastfeeding is disgusting
- Normative belief about breastfeeding in public
- NOT sexual dimension of the breast



Demographics

Who?

- Men less likely to be supportive than women
- Older members of the public less likely to be supportive than younger ones
- No religious affiliation more likely to be supportive

Media usage?

- Frequent Daily Mail / Daily Telegraph readers less likely to be supportive
- Frequent Guardian readers
 / TV or radio news more
 likely to be supportive



Conclusion

- Complex topic
- Partly addressed some gaps in current understanding about UK attitudes towards breastfeeding in public
- Avenues for social marketing campaigns
 - Empathy for breastfeeding mothers
 - Breastmilk image
 - Norm based intervention?
 - Explore in more depth the themes identified with members of the public holding strong negative views
 - Target through specific media outlets
