

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACTS

Abstracts must not exceed **250 words** and be submitted before **12pm Monday February 20th**.

Abstracts must specify at the top whether this is submission for a **POSTER** or **ORAL** presentation of your research. For those interested in both we ask you to specify this in your abstract submission. However, if you are successful you will be asked for only one contribution either a poster or a talk.

Abstracts should briefly outline the main research question(s), research method, results and conclusions as well as their contribution to knowledge. References might be added. The abstract should be written in English, be jargon free and follow this format (12-pts. Arial).

Titles should be no longer than 15 words long. The abstract must contain the full name (first name and last name, no titles), affiliation and address of corresponding author. In the case of joint authorships, the name of the corresponding author should be indicated with an asterisk.

Submission of the abstract should be sent via email to doc symp@shu.ac.uk in an attached word document. The email should state your name, year of study and your research centre. Upon review of the abstracts, notification of acceptance will be made by February 22nd. Further guidelines will be sent to successful applications for presentation on this date.
