# What is the SHU Doctoral Showcase?

- Part of the Creating Knowledge Conference
- An opportunity for selected finalists to create an interactive exhibition of their doctoral research for visitors and judges to view throughout the day
- Developed out of the Research Image and Doctoral Researcher of the Year competitions piloted at SHU in 2018
- Based on The University of York's PhD spotlight competition\*

## Doctoral Showcase "Rules"

- The competition is open to all post-RF2 doctoral researchers
- Any medium can be used (e.g. poster, film, objects/artefacts etc)
- Selected finalists will showcase their research at the conference on 17 June 2019
- Finalists must attend the whole day and participate in the exhibition at key audience times
- Finalists will receive a small amount of funding towards the cost of producing their piece



# Doctoral Showcase pieces should:

- Be visually appealing, well presented, and coherent (colour/contrast/font)
- Avoid undue reliance on third-party copyright material
- Put across a clear message regarding the original nature of the research
- Be designed in a way which will be accessible to an academic, non-specialist audience

# 4 Judging criteria

- 1. clarity of message about the originality of the research and its potential outcomes/impact
- 2. ability to explain the underpinning research aims and choice of method(s)
- 3. relevance outside a single field, and ability to excite those working in other disciplines
- 4. appropriateness for a non-specialist, academic audience

#### There are 2 main parts:

- non-specialist summary
- proposal for an exhibition piece



# 1. Non-specialist summary

#### Briefly outline:

- the original nature of your research and its potential outcomes/impact
- why you have taken this methodological approach
- the relevance/appeal of your work outside of your field or discipline

(Maximum 2,000 characters\*)

# 2. Proposal for an exhibition piece

 Describe your exhibition piece, including the media you plan to use (e.g. a combination of poster, film, object/artefact) and why.

(Maximum 2000 characters)

#### Think about:

- What could you do to bring your research alive?
- What will you do with your space?
