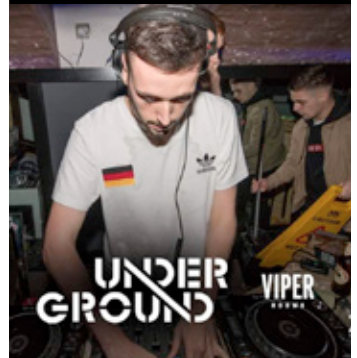
Free film screening – Crazy Rich Asians Peak Lecture Theatre
