A Brief History of the Faculty

1348 Charles University, founded by Charles IV is the oldest university in the Czech Republic and in the whole of Central Europe.

October 27, 1945 a decree on teacher education by the President of Czechoslovakia

1946 State legislation relating to faculties of education throughout Czechoslovakia led to the **foundation of the Faculty of Education**.

1953 School Reform Act. All Czech faculties of education dismantled. A newly-created institution, the Pedagogical Faculty, was established for training teachers of general subjects.

mid-1970s The unification and merging of the training networks of primary and secondary school teachers and the extension of the length of study up to five years.

1989 The Velvet Revolution. The Faculty of Education is transformed into an institution whose main mission is the university education of teachers of all types and levels of schools, including experts and researchers in pedagogy, educational psychology and pedagogy/didactics of school subjects and educational fields.

The Faculty of Education is one of 17 faculties of Charles University.

The department focusses primarily on connecting theory from pedagogy, psychology and didactics together with theory emerging from reflection on practice. The Department offers also a specialism in Drama Education for primary school teachers.

Pedagogical and Psychological Departments

In teacher education

These departments provide the pedagogical and psychological elements of teacher preparation programmes for students in all faculties. Teaching activities are focussed on the development of reading literacy, on specific learning and behavioural disorders, on the process of school socialisation, the upbringing and education of people with different types and sorts of disadvantage, on support and development of communication strategies for and activation of people with health disabilities and social disadvantage, on diagnostics and consulting, on the specialist pedagogical support and education of clients from the early years, through school to adulthood with regard to education, healthcare and the social or working worlds.

Graduates can be employed as teaching assistants, experts in pedagogical-psychological counselling, teaching assistants for pupils with special educational needs, assistants of project managers in non-profit organisations, foundations and in organisations supporting the education of people with special needs and learning disabilities. 

They focus on topics of stereotypes legitimisation in Czech society – the verification and integration of theoretical frameworks and innovative approaches in the didactics of History, including development of digital application for work with sources etc.

Namely, in mathematics, a specific scheme-oriented teaching method has been developed (https://www.h-mat.cz/en) and in IT and subjects based on informatics, Seymour Papert's ideas, Logo culture and DIY philosophy are used as starting points of teaching approaches.



A concept development theory (the theory of generic models known as H-mat) has been developed by prof. Milan Hejný and his research team. It is used as a basis for an innovative teaching approach, namely teaching aimed at the development of schema. This method has been successfully implemented in teaching practice and teacher education.
