Language of study

PJAIT offers full English paths, MA and BA level, of the Information Technology degree and Graphic Design degree. All courses and tutoring is held in English. Exchange students are advised to choose courses from English paths for their mobility period at PJAIT.

Nevertheless, exchange students are free and welcome to choose Polish path courses too.

Interior Design study path at PJAIT is offered in Polish only. However, the staff provides mentorship for Erasmus+ students in English.

Recommended language skills

The minimum level of English language proficiency we recommend for incoming students is B2 (CEFR scale).

Language courses

PJAIT offers free intensive English/Polish language courses, starting about one month before the 1st semester. Terms of the course and details are announced usually right before the start of the semester.

Erasmus students are free to attend any language courses administered by PJAIT's Foreign Languages Department. The Languages Department provides English, Polish, German, Russian, Italian and Spanish courses.

Insurance

Insurance

All Erasmus students must provide medical, accident and travel insurance for themselves. Insurance should include the cost of repatriation (assisted transfer of a person back to their home country in case of serious injury or illness). The insurance has to be covering the whole period of stay at Polish-Japanese Academy of Information Technology. EU students should also hold a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC card). Incoming students should e-mail a copy of their insurance doc to PJAIT's International Office, before their mobility period.
