#### Where we are



Zaragoza is a modern city with a population of around 700,000 and a rich historical and artistic heritage thanks to its 2000 years of history. Sometimes known as the 'City of the Four Cultures', it is located on the River Ebro, halfway between Madrid and Barcelona, 11½2 hours from both on the AVE high-speed train. Zaragoza is a small, safe city with a good public transport system, good accommodation, plenty of student-life and is well connected for visiting other parts of Spain.

What to see: With a wide range of theatres, cinemas, exhibitions, concerts, festivals and fairs, every type of art movement and cultural alternative is available on the streets of the lively city and on the stages of the Auditorio, the Teatro Principal or the Palacio de Congresos. Zaragoza also has an important historical legacy: the ruins of the Roman city, the Moorish Aljaferia Palace, mudejar-style churches, the baroque Pilar basilica or the works of locally born Francisco de Goya. The Pilar festival in October is famous all over Spain for its non-stop celebrations that go on for over a week.

Where to eat: One of the traditions of Zaragoza is going out for tapas in the old part of town, called 'El Tubo', full of both older and newer bars offering a wide range of local delicacies.

Where to stay: There are plenty of possibilities, both in Zaragoza and nearer to the University in the village of Villanueva de Gállego, in different apartments, university residences or hostals.
