What you need to know in 250 words

Increase your impact

Publishing your work Open Access helps to build your impact and reputation. It allows you to disseminate your research more widely with minimal effort.

Research shows that Open Access articles are cited more often than articles behind a pay wall.

To make your work Open Access at no cost, deposit it in the SHU Research Archive (SHURA, <http://shura.shu.ac.uk>) where you can view download statistics as well as gauge your impact in social media (altmetrics).

Be eligible for the REF

In order to be eligible for the next Research Excellence Framework (REF), the final peer-reviewed manuscript of any article in a journal or conference proceedings with an ISSN number :

- must be deposited in SHURA
- must be deposited within three months of the date of acceptance.

You must also provide proof of the date of acceptance. This will usually be an email or letter from the journal editor or conference organiser. Please send this to shura@shu.ac.uk.

This evidence will be kept with your record in SHURA.

Your final peer-reviewed manuscript will

be free to read and download by anyone with an internet connection, if necessary after an embargo period set by the publisher.

Register your work in SHURA

The University requires you to record and deposit any research output — whether an article, book chapter, monograph or other output — in SHURA on acceptance by your publisher, even if the output cannot be made available via Open Access.

Simply upload your work to SHURA and fill out a short form. Library staff will ensure your deposit conforms to publishers', funders' and REF rules on Open Access, including admissible embargo periods. You can add your work at <http://shura.shu.ac.uk/add.html>.
